

SoS Local Broadband Plan

- South of Scotland Alliance (SoSA) - strategic partnership between partners shown below
- Sept 2011 - SoSA Local Broadband Plan submitted Scottish Government
 - Total cost of £120m - to deliver NGB to 94% of South of Scotland and minimum of 2mpbs to remaining 6%

SoS Local Broadband Plan

- Deliver to 35 market towns – fibre rollout has to go to main centres first
- Extend fibre rollout out to public sector ‘Pathfinder’ sites
- Work with communities in the final 10-15% to identify alternative funding solutions to deliver Infrastructure in parallel to National rollout.
- Moving target - BT now committed to supplying NGB to Galashiels, Peebles, Innerleithen, Dumfries, Stranraer

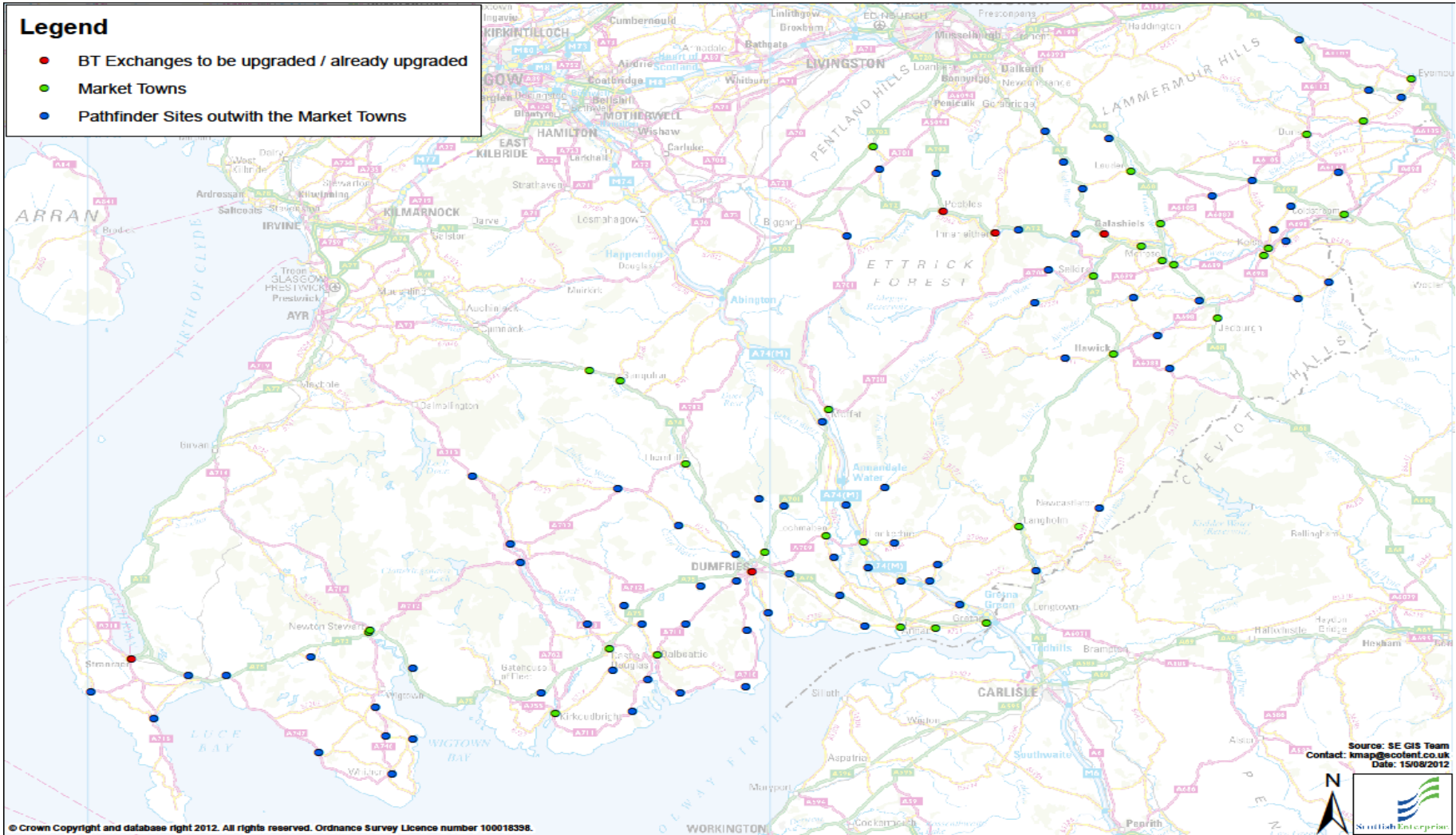

SoSA Targets

- BT commitment = 25% population cover
- 35 Market towns = 64% cover
- Extra Pathfinder sites = 94% cover

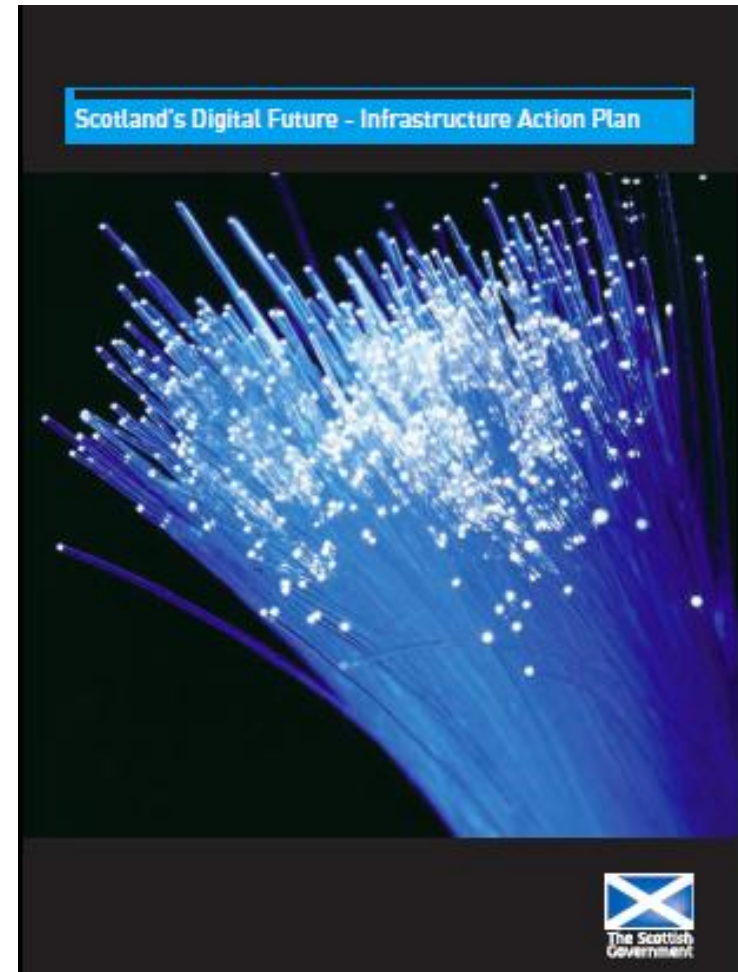
National Digital Infrastructure Action Plan

Programme 1: Achieving a step change by 2015 40 – 80Mbps for between 85% to 90% of premises.

Programme 2: Achieving world-class by 2020 90% of homes and business to have access to minimum of 100Mbps by 2020; With 40% access to 100Mbps by 2015.

Programme 3: Demonstrating and delivering innovative and local solutions. Support final 10% communities through Community Broadband Scotland fund.

Programme 4: Increasing take-up and stimulating demand. Rate of broadband take-up by people in Scotland should be at or above the UK average by 2013, and should be highest among the UK nations by 2015.

Ongoing SoSA Role

Demand Stimulation

- SoSA Demand Registration website includes survey to register demand
 - Currently 875 respondents (5th Nov), of which 13 were outwith the SoS
- Four Groupings
 - Business Sector (252 businesses registered within SoS)
 - Residents (575 individuals)
 - Small Communities (26 community groups)
 - Public Sector (9 public sector representatives)
- Demand and Uptake critical to success – NGB Project Team working with partners to deliver Strategy through existing community and business advisers.
