Destination Tweed Connecting Threads: 2025 artist residencies open call



We are pleased to announce the Destination Tweed Connecting Threads 2025 residency programme, offering up to six paid and supported residency opportunities for creative practitioners based in the River Tweed catchment area.

These residencies form a key strand of the Connecting Threads programme for 2025, under the overall theme of Watery Commons. The residency begins with an initial Encounters week in June during which all selected residents will spend time together with the Connecting Threads programming team along the River Tweed. Thereafter, each resident has two months to undertake the remaining three weeks of the residency at their own pace. The deadline for expressions of interest is Monday 31 March, 9am.

The range of activities has also been incredible. We have had tree-planting days, community litter picks, circular economy art workshops, clothes swaps, garden re-vamps, hot composter installations, community garden open days, environmental film screenings and so much more! All of these commitments showcase the incredible creativity and determination within our network of community climate action.
