South West Scotland Coastal Way milestone!



Work to improve access to part of the coastal core path at Borgue has recently been completed, including gate & boardwalk replacements, bridge creation and extensive vegetation removal. This milestone marks the end of our infrastructure work for the 2024/2025 financial year, which has included core path improvement works at Annan, Dumfries and New Abbey. Opportunity to join the South of Scotland Regional Economic Partnership - deadline 10th February

People from across the South of Scotland are being encouraged to apply to become a member of the Regional Economic Partnership (REP), the forum that sets the direction of the regional economy across Dumfries and Galloway and Scottish Borders.

The REP is looking to appoint a total of eight external members, representing the following sectors:

- Four representatives from business and enterprise (private sector)
- Two social enterprise representatives
- Two community representatives

Neighbourhood Ecosystem Fund Open for applications - deadline 3rd March

The Neighbourhood Ecosystem Fund from Inspiring Scotland aims to help communities develop their ideas for ecosystem restoration into a pipeline of deliverable projects.

- Community groups can apply for up to £13,500
- Place-based community groups with an income of under £200,000 can apply
- Projects should focus on the development and feasibility stages of undertaking ecosystem restoration, rather than physical delivery.
- Successful applicants will receive up to £1,500 in professional fundraising support in addition to their grant.
- Projects must be delivered between 1 June 2025 31 March 2026.

Deadline for applications is 12pm (midday) Monday 3 March 2025.
