SCAMP Landscape Connections Launched



SUP is delighted to be a partner on this exciting new project, led by Dumfries and Galloway Council, which launched earlier this month. The project is the first to be funded under the National Lottery Heritage Fund's new Landscape Connection programme. Solway Coast and Marine Project (SCAMP) Landscape Connections will be delivered over 10 years, starting with a two-year development phase.

Alongside protecting and developing the seascape, the project will engage young people and communities with the coast, providing green job opportunities and training for nature and habitat restoration. More people will be able to access and understand the landscape through 120 miles of new coastal trail.

Wildlife Recording in full flow for SWSEIC

A busy summer of wildlife recording activities and events is already in full swing for South West Scotland Environmental Information Centre (SWSEIC). The recording group has completed four surveys so far, gathering over 1,000 records covering several hundred different species. Visits to Glenmidge, Moffat Community Nature Reserves, Tardoes Farm (Muirkirk) and Eastriggs MOD site have added valuable information about the diversity of species present on each site. It allows us to point out important biodiversity-rich habitats to landowners and adds to our regional knowledge of the species we find. Working with our friends at Kilsture Forest Community Group and their Kilsture 1000 project (<u>https://www.kilstureforest.org/get-involved-2/kilsture1000</u>), we have been teaching volunteers to identify amphibians and reptiles and will be helping them to map all of their wildlife sightings later this summer.
