SUP Development Manager appointments

South West Scotland Coastal Way

With huge thanks to the People's Project, Mark Jardine, Dumfries & Galloway Council's Coastal Benefit Fund and South of Scotland Enterprise, we are delighted to announce we are several steps closer to developing a long-distance coastal walking route spanning the Dumfries & Galloway Coast (Gretna – Stranraer). The funding will enable continuation of the project until June 2025.

Our aim is to try and make the route as accessible as possible, and funding will allow for boardwalk replacement, vegetation control and changes/replacements of gates to coastal core paths and Rights of Way along the route at Annan, Dumfries – Cargenbridge, New Abbey and Borgue.

A potential route has been surveyed between Gretna and Isle of Whithorn so far, with a few gaps identified. These sections will see some further careful thinking and planning, in consultation with communities, landowners and our partners at D&G Council. We are also looking forward to continuing surveying westwards, where capacity allows.

A Just transition for Dumfries and Galloway

The <u>Just Transition Commission</u> is in an independent group that advises the Scottish Government on how to cut carbon emissions in a fair way. It includes experts and leaders from trade unions, voluntary organisations, environmental groups, business and industry

The Commission is visiting Dumfries on the 22nd and 23rd of August and they invite you to their final roundtable on 23rd August (12:00 – 14:15) at the Crichton (Duncan – Easterbrook Hall).

The Commission's visit to the region will seek to cover a range of core just transition topics, including housing, agriculture and forestry. The purpose of this roundtable is to bring together stakeholders in the region to discuss the opportunities, challenges and the key considerations for achieving a fair transition to net zero in Dumfries and Galloway. Following the roundtable, the Commission will publish a briefing sharing findings and advice
